WHEREAS, career and technical education builds collaborative connections among education, economic development and workforce development to support healthy economic growth; and

WHEREAS, career and technical education offers opportunities for student leadership experiences supporting personal and professional growth, opportunities to apply academic knowledge and skills in meaningful contexts through partnerships with postsecondary institutions, business, industry, and community; and

WHEREAS, seven state career and technical student organizations serve more than 49,000 students in New Jersey through membership in Future Business leaders of America (FBLA); National FFA Association; Family, Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA); DECA Inc., an Association of Marketing Students; HOSA – Future Health Professional; Technology Student Association (TSA) and SkillsUSA; and
